- Help the child improve their use of language, focused attention, story-telling, literacy skills, memory and self-esteem.
- Expertly direct the child's play to be utilised as a way to process stressful and traumatic life events.
- Utilise play to help the child improve relationships and give the child a sense of control and empowerment. Ensure it is cathartic, and a fun and positive experience.

- Have a tertiary degree qualification in Play Therapy.
- Be eligible for registration with APPTA.
- Have the choice of full-time or part-time and contractor or employee position.
